Daily school attendance is critical to student success and formation. In addition to attending regular classes, participating in school liturgies, assemblies, retreats, and school activity days are compulsory for all students. The school expects all students to attend these events as they are integral to our school's mission and building community at St. Paul's. Please avoid scheduling appointments or excusing your son's absence from these events. Days with late starts for students (highlighted yellow on the year calendar) and no school days (highlighted orange on the year calendar) should be used for appointments or activities that would otherwise result in school absences. The school strongly discourages planning family trips or other activities that result in multiple-day absences while school is in session.

Please ensure your son is available for all exam dates as indicated. Manitoba Education and Early Childhood Learning requires grade 12 students to write provincial standards assessments in Grade 12 English and Mathematics. Alternative dates are not available for these exams. Alternate exam dates for school-based exams will be granted only under exceptional circumstances and must be approved by the principal well in advance of the exam date.

Additional information about the opening of school, including your son's timetable, will be mailed in late-August. I wish you and your family a safe and enjoyable summer and look forward to seeing you at one of many school events in the coming school year.

School Supplies

Students are expected to have standard school supplies such as a 3-inch binder to hold course notes, loose-leaf paper, dividers, pens, and pencils, as well as a standard scientific calculator with DAL (Direct Algebraic Logic); teachers may be explaining other requirements to students on the first day of classes. Students are encouraged to purchase a laptop for use at school. St. Paul's provides wi-fi access and a Microsoft 365 account to all students to support their learning.

Dress Code I (Regular Dress Code)

- Effective: November 1–April 30
- Dress shirt with collar; tie optional
- Dress pants, socks, and dress belt
- Sport-coat, blazer, or suit-jacket
- Dress shoes

Dress Code II: Warm Weather Dress Code

- Effective: September 6–October 31 and May 1–June 27
- Dress Code I with the following optional changes.
 - Option A: no suit-jacket
 - Option B: St. Paul's polo may be worn in lieu of a shirt, tie, and suit-jacket.
 - Option C: St. Paul's polo worn with dress (chino) shorts (beige, navy, or black). Dress shoes are replaced with athletic (gym) shoes for this option.

Dress Code V: Formal Dress Code

During formal occasions, including all Masses and other special events designated by the school, students will be required to dress more formally.

- All elements of Dress Code I will be required with the following addition:
 - o A tie must be worn. Standard neckties or bowties are acceptable.
